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ONE|NB Launches \$1M, Community -led Participatory Budgeting Initiative

PROVIDENCE, RI - ONE Neighborhood Builders, one of the state's leading community development corporations, officially kicked off the idea collection phase of a \$1 million, community -led participatory budgeting initiative last week. As part of this phase, ONE|NB is accelerating efforts to solicit ideas from neighbors about how to invest \$1 million in the community. In the coming weeks, ONE|NB and the Nine Neighborhood Fund Steering Committee will host idea collection town halls and meetings with community partners. The steering committee is made up of individuals who live, work or learn here.

At a community town hall last Wednesday open to all central Providence neighbors, ONE|NB promoted a new website - <u>www.DecideRl.org</u> - as an added tool to capture community ideas and input.

"No one knows what a community needs more than the people who live and work in that community. The Nine Neighborhood Fund is an ambitious initiative designed to shift power to local community members. Through a public and transparent process, local residents will have a direct and democratic opportunity to invest \$1 million in local community projec ts," said **ONE|NB Executive Director Jennifer Hawkins** . "Thanks to support from EOHHS and a generous philanthropic partner, we have created the largest known participatory budgeting initiative in Rhode Island. I look forward to seeing the ideas the community y puts forward and cannot wait to open the polls next Spring."

Participatory budgeting provides a democratic process for individuals who live in the community to make direct decisions about how to spend components of a budget. The Nine Neighborhoods Fund is the largest known participatory budget allocation in Rhode Island and is focused on improving community health outcomes and strengthening quality of life throughout Central Providence.

The state Executive Office of Health & Human Services and Department of Health invested \$450,000 through the Central Providence Opportunities: A Health Equity Zone. ONE|NB secured an additional \$550,000 in private grant funding to bring the total Nine Neighborhood Fund budget to \$1 million. Community members can steer Ni ne Neighborhood Fund

investments toward community development needs in the Elmhurst, Federal Hill, Hartford, Olneyville, Manton, Mount Pleasant, Valley, Silver Lake, and Smith Hill neighborhoods. The Pawtucket Central Falls HEZ also received \$450,000 from EOHHS for their own participatory budgeting project.

"This is a way for residents to come together as a community, decide what they need, and invest funds in a way that benefits them the most," said **Wole Akinbi, a member of the Nine Neighborhood Fund Stee ring Committee**. "It's empowering to watch the community define its own needs."

During the Town Hall meeting last week, community members discussed everything from the development of new ball fields to improvements to public transportation. The next Nine Neighborhood Fund town hall meeting is scheduled for Saturday, December 10 at 10:00am. It will be held at Casa de Adoracion Juda (381 Manton Avenue, Providence). Food, children's activities, and Spanish translation services will be provided.

Earlier this year, a 17-member steering committee of residents drafted the rules to guide the entire participatory budgeting process. Based on this rulebook, individuals have until December 9, 2022 to submit ideas via dropboxes, town hall meetings, and website submissions. In early 2023, volunteer Project Budget Delegates will work with the Steering Committee to turn the ideas into fully fledged proposals. From May 27 to June 10, polls will open to allow every 02908 and 02909 resident over the age of 13 the opportunity t o vote on their preferred proposals. Poll locations will be announced in May. Winning projects will be made public by early summer.

Funds cannot be used to supplement existing programs, services, or projects that normally would be funded by state or local government. In addition, there are program cost limitations to ensure that smaller projects can be achieved. More information is available at <u>www.DecideRl.org</u>.
